2 WORDS FROM PASTOR DAVID

2021 Vision

"Where there is no vision, the people perish." (Proverbs 29:18 KJV)

In the last few weeks of my Lenten sermon series on "*God' Everlasting Covenants*," I have been talking about God's 3-step plan to enable us to do the impossible.

Step one is justification. It is impossible for us to pay the penalty for our sin, but we don't have to. Jesus has done it for us. God so loved the world that he sent his only begotten Son to become one of us and to go to the cross, taking upon himself the full penalty for our sin, so that all we need to do is believe in him, believe that he has done it all. It's as simple as that, impossibly simple. Believe in Jesus and receive the gift of eternal life. The barrier of sin that separates us from God has been removed completely. Our sins are forgiven and are no longer even remembered by God! God the Father welcomes us with open arms, eager to make us his children.

Step two is sanctification. Anyone who earnestly tries finds it impossible to keep God's law. It's not that God's expectations of us are unreasonable. The problem is with us. Every one of us has been corrupted by sin. The law represents God's best for us, but our old sinful nature always fights against God's law. Thankfully, when we believe in Christ and are baptized, the Holy Spirit gives us new life, a new nature, and dwells within us and is in the process of writing the law on our hearts and minds. It will no longer be an external thing that is foreign to our nature, we will be fully in line with God's law. It will become second nature to us to follow the law because we love Jesus.

Step three is glorification. Surely it is impossible for us to share in God's glory. We have no right to glorify ourselves. We often say, "to God alone be the glory." Amazingly it has been God's plan from the beginning to share His glory with us. We have been made in God's image to perfectly reflect God's glory. We are being remade in the image of Christ and will shine like the

stars. This step will not be fully implemented until Jesus returns to reign on the earth. But Jesus' reign is not entirely future. It has begun and we, the church, are to use the gifts given to us to expand Jesus' reign over the earth, as more and more people come to know Jesus and acknowledge Him as their King. Our focus needs to be bringing glory to Christ through our lives.

The Holy Spirit is essential to all three steps or stages in the New Covenant. Without the Holy Spirit, we cannot believe and become children of God. Without the Spirit we cannot obey God's law. Without the Spirit we cannot stand against the spiritual forces of darkness at work in the world. But with the Spirit we can do all these things.

Just as we need the Spirit in order to grow in holiness, we need the Spirit to be effective in ministry. That's why Jesus instructed the disciples to wait until the Holy Spirit was poured out on the church to begin the monumental task of making disciples of all nations. Over 2000 years the church has made tremendous progress. Between a quarter and a third of the earth's population acknowledges Jesus as Lord. There is still more work to be done and Holy Cross has a part to play in that work. But only if we are operating under the direction and power of the Holy Spirit.

That's where vision comes in. Without vision the church will fail and perish. Each person naturally has their own ideas about the direction our ministry should take. The ideas of some are sure to conflict with others. But it doesn't have to be that way. If we each adopt the mindset of Christ, "not my will, but thy will," the Holy Spirit will lead us to a common vision for the future of Holy Cross.

Here are three steps in developing a common vision that will guide us into the future:

1. Surrender your agenda to God's agenda. It is likely that much is in common between the two, but be open to new concerns and insights.
2. Pray for wisdom, for God to show you His vision for Holy Cross. If you're fasting and praying for Lent, this would be an excellent prayer focus for the final week of Lent.

3. Share your vision with others. If God has answered your prayers and given you insight, share what you have learned with me or a member of council.

What an awesome privilege to share in the building of Christ's kingdom! Let us embrace that responsibility and give ourselves wholeheartedly to the work of ministry. To God be the glory!

Council Actions:



Lutheran Denomination Task Force

Council has commissioned a task force to investigate and to make a recommendation for changing our affiliation to a Lutheran denomination whose teaching and mission are consistent with our congregation's core values and our historical and ongoing commitment to the inspiration and authority of the Scriptures.

At our first meeting on March 10, the task force identified the following steps to begin the process:

- 1) investigate the benefits and consequences of changing denominational affiliation;
- 2) become familiar with the process for making such a change, including consulting with congregations who have gone through it;
- 3) learn about alternative Lutheran denominations;
- 4) consult with representatives of denominations that appear to be a good fit for Holy Cross.

The members of the task force are Pastor David, Joan Rosenthal, Dawn Schaeffer, Bob Harwick, Ken Yoxheimer, and Lyn & Jan Styker. 
