WE GATHER IN GOD'S PRESENCE

I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the LORD." (Psalm 122:1)

PRELUDE AND PREPARATION

During the prelude, prepare your heart for worship: read the introduction, find the Scripture readings in your Bible or the pew Bible, and pray. You may pray: God of grace, You have given us minds to know You, hearts to love You, and voices to sing Your praise. Fill us with Your Spirit, that we may celebrate Your glory and worship You in spirit and truth, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. AMEN.

CHILDREN

INTRODUCTION

Jesus does not leave His followers orphaned. Through the Holy Spirit Jesus comes to abide with His disciples of every generation. As Pentecost draws near, we are reminded that the risen Christ dwells in us as the Spirit of truth. In yielding our lives to the Spirit we experience God's love and are transformed to be the body of the risen Christ and carry out His redemptive ministry in the world.

COMMEMORATION

Matthias, apostle - After Christ's ascension, the apostles met in Jerusalem to choose a replacement for Judas. Matthias was chosen over Joseph Justus by the casting of lots. Little is known about Matthias, and little is reported about him in the account of his election in Acts 1:15-26. Matthias traveled among the disciples from the time of Jesus' baptism until his ascension. His task, after he was enrolled among the eleven remaining disciples, was to bear witness to the resurrection.

WELCOME AND MEDITATION

(Please rise.)

- P: Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, by Whose Spirit we have been reborn to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.
- C: AMEN.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

P: Rejoicing in Christ's victory over sin and death, let us come before God Who calls us to repentance.

(Please kneel. Silence is kept for reflection.)

- P: God of life, C: in raising Jesus from the tomb, You make everything new. We confess our failure to live the good news of the resurrection. Our hearts are slow to believe Your promises. We shut our doors in fear. We resist the Holy Spirit. Forgive us, O God, and renew us to embrace without fear the new life You have given us in Jesus Christ. AMEN.
- P: People of God: Christ is alive. Sin and death have lost their power. Through the waters of baptism you have been born anew by the living word of God. Know that your sins are for-given in Jesus' name and that the Spirit of the risen Christ is alive in you both now and forever.
- C: AMEN.

GREETING (*Please rise.*)

- P: Alleluia! Christ is risen.
- C: Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!
- P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.
- C: And also with you.

WE PRAISE GOD'S NAME

With one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. "Let all the peoples praise him." (Romans 15:6,11)

I cried out to Him with my mouth;


His praise was on my tongue.

MOTHER'S DAY LITANY (Please kneel.)

- P: Thank You, Father, for Your loving, hands-on care, imparting to us dignity from before our beginning, making us in Your image.
- C: "You created my inmost being; You knit me together in my mother's womb ... My frame was not hidden from You when I was made in the secret place ... Your eyes saw my unformed body. I praise You because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; Your works are wonderful, I know that full well." (*Ps* 139:13-16)
- L: Dear Heavenly Father, You set the solitary in families. We praise and thank You for all parents, including those who parent their grandchildren or the children of others. We commend to Your loving care all the homes where Your people live. Keep them free from bitterness, and from pride in self. Let for-

giveness and love flow freely. Knit together with enduring affection those who have become one in marriage. Let children and parents have full respect for one another as one respects Your image in which we are made. Grant the solitary special friends in Christ. Send, by Your Spirit, sufficient grace for all.

C: Lord, we ask Your blessing and grace on all mothers. Thank you for their parental role in our lives.

- P: John's Gospel tell us that during His crucifixion, "When Jesus saw His mother there, and the disciple whom He loved standing nearby, He said to His mother, '*Dear woman, here is your son,*' and to the disciple, '*Here is your mother.*' From that time on, this disciple took her into his home." (John 19:26-27)
- C: We thank You, Father, that You will parent us should our parents forsake and forget us (*Psalm 27:10; Isaiah* 49:15-16). We thank You for all foster and adoptive parents and ask You to bless those relationships.
- L: Paul wrote to Timothy, "I have been reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also." (*1 Timothy 1:5*)
- C: We thank You, Father, for our mothers and grandmothers, both our biological ones and those whom You gave to us in the faith, who have prayed for us and passed on to us the good news of Your grace, who by their example encouraged us in our own faith.
- P: Father in Heaven, we remember today those who are no longer with us. We miss them at times like this. We thank You that they are with You and Your Son in the place prepared for them where all things are made new no more tears, no more suffering, no more heartaches.
- C: Come, Holy Spirit, and comfort all who miss their mothers, and other special loved ones. Keep us in union with them here through faith and love toward You, that hereafter we may enter into Your Presence and be numbered with those who serve You and look upon Your face in glory everlasting, through Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.


WE ARE SENT INTO GOD'S WORLD
