During the prelude, prepare your heart for worship: read the introduction, find the Scripture readings in your Bible or the pew Bible, and pray.



INTRODUCTION

Today's festival derives its name from the Jewish festival of Pentecost, observed 50 days after Passover. On the 50th day of Easter, we celebrate the Holy Spirit as the power of God among us that heals, forgives, inspires, and unites. In the reading from Acts, images of wind and fire



describe the Spirit poured out on disciples of all nations. In John's gospel the risen Christ breathes the Spirit on His followers on Easter evening. In the one Spirit we are baptized into one body, and at the Lord's table the Spirit unites us for witness in the world.

WELCOME AND MEDITATION

THANKSGIVING FOR BAPTISM

(= All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism.)

P: Blessed be the holy Trinity, one God, Who gives us a new birth into a living hope, Who raises us with Christ from death, Who fills us with the Holy Spirit.

C: AMEN.

L: Joined to Christ in the waters of baptism, we are clothed with God's mercy and forgiveness. Let us give thanks for the gift of baptism.

(Please kneel.) (Water may be poured into the font.)

- P: Blessed are You, O God, maker and ruler of all things. Your voice thundered over the waters at creation. You water the mountains and send springs into the valleys to refresh and satisfy all living things.
- L: Through the waters of the Flood You carried those in the Ark to safety. You led Your people Israel from slavery to freedom. In the wilderness You nourished them with water from the rock, and You brought them across the river Jordan to the promised land.
- P: By the baptism of His death and resurrection, Your Son Jesus has carried us to safety and freedom. The floods shall not overwhelm us, and the deep shall not swallow us up, for Christ has brought us over to the land of promise. He sends us to make disciples, baptizing in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- L: Pour out Your Holy Spirit; wash away sin in this cleansing water; clothe the baptized with Christ; and claim us as Your children, no longer slave or free, no longer male or female, but one with all the baptized in Christ Jesus, Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: AMEN.

P: We have unshakable certainty that we are forgiven, and nothing separates us from the love of the Father which we have in His Son because of this reality: Alleluia! Christ is risen!

C: Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

GREETING (Please rise.)

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.

C: And also with you.

WE PRAISE GOD'S NAME

With one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. "Let all the peoples praise him." (Romans 15:6,11)





SMALL CATECHISM READING

- L: Let us confess our faith by reading a portion of Luther's Small Catechism, *Part II. The Creed:*
- L: What is The Third Article of the Creed: On Becoming Holy?
- C: I believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy catholic church, the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. AMEN.
- L: What does this mean?
- C: I believe that I cannot believe in my Lord Jesus Christ or come to Him by my own intelligence or power. But the Holy Spirit called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, made me holy and preserved me in the true faith, just as He calls, gathers together, enlightens and makes holy the whole Church on earth and keeps it with Jesus in the one, true faith. In this Church, He generously forgives each day every sin committed by me and by every believer. On the last day, the Holy Spirit will raise me and all the dead from the grave and will give eternal life to me and to all who believe in Christ. This is most certainly true!





THE GREAT THANKSGIVING (ELW p 129) (Please rise.)





P: It is indeed right, our duty and our joy that we should at all times and in all places offer thanks and praise to You, O Lord, holy Father, through Christ our Lord; Who rose beyond the bounds of death, and on this day, as He had promised, poured out Your Spirit of life and power upon the chosen disciples. At this the whole earth exults in boundless joy. And so, with the Church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise Your name and join their unending hymn: (WOV p 22)



PRAYER AND WORDS OF INSTITUTION

P: Holy, mighty, and merciful Lord, heaven and earth are full of Your glory. In great love You sent to us Jesus, Your Son, Who reached out to heal the sick and suffering, Who preached good news to the poor, and Who, on the cross, opened His arms to all.

In the night in which He was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is My body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me.

Again, after supper, He took the cup; gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: this cup is the new covenant in My blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of Me.

Remembering, therefore, His death, resurrection, and ascension, we await His coming in glory.

C: AMEN. Come, Lord Jesus. Come, Holy Spirit.



THE LORD'S PRAYER (sung) (please be seated after "Amen") Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

All who are baptized and trust in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior may partake. Please fill out a communication card and put it in the offering plate. You may kneel at the altar rail or to maintain greater physical distance stand a foot back from the altar rail. Gluten-free rice wafers (blue-green) are available. 

LITANY OF REMEMBRANCE

- P: Jesus said, "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends." (*John 15:13*) We remember this day all those men and women who have served our country in the Armed Forces, serving often in harm's way, and at great personal risk and sacrifice. Many have experienced the horrors and evils of war in unmentionable ways that have left them deeply affected in their inner person. The price to them and to their family and friends has been high. We remember them this day in gratitude and thanksgiving for their unselfish sacrifice for the greater good of humanity.
- C: Lord God, Heavenly Father, we thank and praise You for all who have sacrificed on our behalf. With them, we also remember with gratitude all our departed friends and relatives who also served, especially ...

- L: Their deeds of faith, love and mercy live on in us. Their valor and courage, their vision and sacrifice are our heritage. May we bring no dishonor upon their names or the work they have entrusted to us.
- C: Daily defend all who are currently serving in harm's way. Strengthen them in their trials and temptations; give them the courage they need; and grant them a sense of Your abiding Presence wherever they may be.
- P: We pray especially for... (those Serving in Armed Forces)
- L: We remember also with thanksgiving those who have risked their lives to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ to all nations. Open the hearts of the people and rulers of nations to receive the Prince of Peace, Who alone can turn this world from hatred and violence.
- C: We pray for the day when peace and love will reign and evil will be permanently defeated. Pour out Your Spirit upon this world, O Lord, that wars may cease, through Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

MEMORIAL BLESSING

P: In your struggle against sin, you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood. Remember with honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice, who have laid down their lives for their friends in service of God and country. Live in such a way that their sacrifice will not have been in vain. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, Who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.
