Prepare your heart for worship: read the introduction, look up the Scripture





SMALL CATECHISM READING

- P: Let us confess our faith by reading a portion of Luther's Small Catechism, *Part IV. The Sacrament of Holy Baptism:*
- P: What is Baptism?
- C: Baptism is not just plain water, but it is water contained within God's command and united with God's Word
- P: Where in the Word of God is this?
- C: Where our Lord Christ spoke in the last chapter of Matthew (Matthew 28:19): "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."
- P: What gifts or benefits does Baptism bestow?
- C: It gives us the forgiveness of sins, redeems us from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as God's words and promises declare.
