WE GATHER IN GOD'S PRESENCE

PRELUDE AND PREPARATION

Prepare your heart for worship: read the introduction, look up the Scripture readings and pray. You may pray: Almighty God, You provide the true bread from heaven, Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Prepare us to receive His body and blood, that abiding in Him, and He in us, we may be filled with the power of His endless life. AMEN.

Introduction

The Lord Jesus was not wealthy or famous. He did not promise his followers that they would possess riches, power, or prestige. He was named a king only in his death. He reigned from the cross, leaving his disciples the treasure of his body and blood. Today we gather at the table of Christ, our merciful and loving ruler. We wear the crown of baptism and trace his royal sign--the holy cross--over our brows and bodies. We leave here strengthened to serve those who are hungry, thirsty, strangers, naked, sick, and imprisoned. We look for the day when all earth's people will see him coming with the scepter of peace and the crown of justice.

WELCOME AND MEDITATION

CALL TO WORSHIP Psalm 100 (congregation: indented)

Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth.

Worship the LORD with gladness;

Come before Him with joyful songs.

Know that the LORD is God.

It is He Who made us, and we are His;

we are His people, the sheep of His pasture.

Enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise;

give thanks to Him and praise His name.

For the LORD is good and His love endures forever;

His faithfulness continues through all generations.




INVOCATION (= All may make the sign of the ross.)

THE CONFESSION OF SINS SBH pages 15-16

P: Beloved in the Lord! Let us draw near with a true heart, and confess our sins unto God our Father, beseeching Him, in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to grant us forgiveness.



(Please kneel. Silence is kept for reflection.)

- P: Almighty God, our Maker and Redeemer, we poor sinners confess unto You, that we are by nature sinful and unclean, and that we have sinned against You by thought, word, and deed.

 Wherefore we flee for refuge to Your infinite mercy, seeking and imploring Your grace, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- C: O most merciful God, Who has given Your onlybegotten Son to die for us, have mercy upon us, and for His sake grant us remission of all our sins; and by Your Holy Spirit increase in us true knowledge of You and of Your will, and true obedience to Your Word, that by Your grace we may come to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.
- P: Almighty God, our heavenly Father, has had mercy upon us, and has given His only Son to die for us, and for His sake forgives us all our sins. To them that believe on His Name, He gives power to become the sons of God, and bestows upon them His Holy Spirit. He that believes and is baptized shall be saved. Grant this, O Lord, unto us all.

SMALL CATECHISM READING (Please rise.)

- L: Let us confess our faith by reading a portion of Luther's Small Catechism, *Part V. Confession:*
- L: What is the Office of the Keys?*
- C: The Office of the Keys is that special authority which Christ has given to His church on earth to forgive the sins of repentant sinners, but to withhold forgiveness from the unrepentant as long as they do not repent.
- L: Where is this written?*
- C: This is what St. John the Evangelist writes in chapter twenty: The Lord Jesus breathed on His disciples and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven." (John 20:22–23)
- L: What do you believe according to these words?*
- C: I believe that when the called ministers of Christ deal with us by His divine command, in particular when they exclude openly unrepentant sinners from the Christian congregation and absolve those who repent of their sins and want to do better, this is just as valid and certain, even in heaven, as if Christ our dear Lord dealt with us Himself.

P: The Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Love of God, and the Communion of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.







THE WORDS OF INSTITUTIONpage 34

P: Holy art Thou, almighty and merciful God. Holy art Thou, and great is the majesty of Thy glory. Thou didst so love the world as to give thine only-begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him might not perish but have everlasting life; Who, having come into the world to fulfill for us Thy holy will and to accomplish all things for our salvation.

Our Lord Jesus Christ, in the night in which He was betrayed, took bread; and, when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples, saying, take, eat; this is My Body, which is given for you; this do in remembrance of Me.

After the same manner also, He took the cup, when He had supped, and, when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, drink ye all of it; this cup is the New Testament in My blood, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins; this do, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of Me.

Remembering, therefore, His salutary precept, His life-giving Passion and Death, His glorious Resurrection and Ascension and the promise of His coming again, we give thanks to Thee, O Lord God Almighty, not as we ought, but as we are able; and we beseech thee mercifully to accept our praise and thanksgiving, and with Thy Word and Holy Spirit to bless us, Thy servants, and these Thine own gifts of bread and wine, so that we and all who partake thereof may be filled with heavenly benediction and grace, and, receiving the remission of sins, be sanctified in soul and body, and have our portion with all Thy saints. And unto Thee, O God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory in Thy holy church, world without end. Amen.

Grape juice (white) is in pre-filled glasses. Those not ready to receive communion may come for a blessing.




