

CHILDREN


We welcome children of all ages. The Children's Library is available if a child needs a break during the service.

INTRODUCTION

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

P: Let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God. (Please kneel. Silence is kept for reflection and personal confession.)

- P: God, our maker and redeemer, C: we have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed. We come for refuge to Your infinite mercy. You have given Your only Son to die for us; have mercy on us, and for His sake, forgive us all our sin. By Your Holy Spirit, increase in us true knowledge of You and Your will, and true obedience to Your word, that by Your grace we may come to everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.
- P: Almighty God has had mercy on us, and God's only Son has been given to die for us, and for His sake God forgives us all our sin. Believing in Jesus' name, you have received power to become the children of God; you have received the gift of the Holy Spirit.

C: AMEN.

GREETING (Please rise.)

P: God of hosts most gracious, God the Son Who saves us, God the Spirit placed upon us, be with you all.

C: And also with you.








SMALL CATECHISM READING

- P: Let us confess our faith by reading a portion of Luther's Small Catechism, *Part III. The Lord's Prayer:*
- P: To Whom do we address the petitions of the Lord's Prayer?
- C: "Our Father who art in heaven." (Matthew 6:9)
- P: What does this mean?
- C: God would thereby tenderly urge us to believe that He is our true Father, and that we are His true children, so that we may ask Him confidently with all assurance, as dear children ask their dear father.
- P: What is The First Petition?
- C: "Hallowed be Thy name." (Matthew 6:9)
- P: What does this mean?
- C: God's name is indeed holy in itself; but we pray in this petition that it may become holy among us also.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING (Please rise.)


P: The LORD be with you. C: And also with you.

P: It is indeed right, our duty and our joy that we should at all times and in all places offer thanks and praise to You, O Lord, Holy Father, through Christ our Lord; Who on this day overcame death and the grave, and by His glorious resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life. WORDS OF INSTITUTION

P: In the night in which He was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is My body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me.

Again, after supper, He took the cup; gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: this cup is the new covenant in My blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of Me.


THE LORD'S PRAYER (sung)

COMMUNION (Please be seated)

P: Jesus said, "I am the true vine. Abide in Me as I abide in you." All who are baptized and trust in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior may partake. Please fill out a communication card and put it in the offering plate. We have returned to kneeling for communion by "tables." People who want to minimize contact and maintain greater physical distance can take a pre-filled glass and stand a foot back from the altar rail. For a gluten-free rice wafer (blue-green) say "Rice." Grape juice (white) is in pre-filled glasses. Those not ready to receive communion may come for a blessing.
