INTRODUCTION

Today's gospel opens with questions about why Jesus and His disciples did not follow the practices of the Pharisees and contemporaries. It ends with the Pharisees and the Herodians beginning to plot Jesus' death. The big issue was Sabbath-keeping. Jesus openly defied the Sabbath restrictions of His day. How does Jesus want His followers to keep the command to remember the Sabbath to keep it holy?



P: God of hosts most gracious, God the Son Who saves us, God the Spirit placed upon us, be with you all.





NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.


THE LORD'S PRAYER (sung)

People who want to minimize contact and maintain greater physical distance can take a pre-filled glass and stand a foot back from the altar rail. For a gluten-free rice wafer (blue-green) say "Rice." Grape juice (white) is in pre-filled glasses. Those not ready to receive communion may come for a blessing.


