
WE GATHER IN GOD'S PRESENCE

PRELUDE AND PREPARATION Prepare your heart for worship: read the introduction, look up the Scripture readings and pray. You

may pray: God of grace, You have given us minds to know You, hearts to love You, and voices to sing Your praise. Fill us with Your Spirit, that we may celebrate Your glory and worship You in spirit and truth, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. AMEN.

INTRODUCTION In today's readings, we recognize the danger of being a prophetic voice in the world. When Amos told what he saw when God held up the plumb line of justice next to Israel—that the poor were being trampled—he was seen as a threat to the power of priests and king. John the Baptist also spoke



truth to power, and Herod had him beheaded. Jesus criticized religious leaders who twisted life-giving practices into heavy burdens. He too would be put to death, as if the grave would silence Him. In Herod's fear that Jesus is John returned from the dead, we may hear hope for the oppressed: that all the prophets killed through the ages are alive in Jesus. We are called to witness to justice in company with them.

C: And also with you.

SMALL CATECHISM READING

- L: What is The Second Petition?
- C: "Thy kingdom come," (Matthew 6:10)
- L: What does this mean?
- C: Truly God's Kingdom comes by itself, without our prayer. But we pray in this request that it may come to us as well.
- L: How does this happen?
- C: It happens when the Heavenly Father gives us His Holy Spirit, so that we believe His holy Word by His grace and live godly lives here in this age and there in eternal life.


